

Course Selection and ECTS Credits

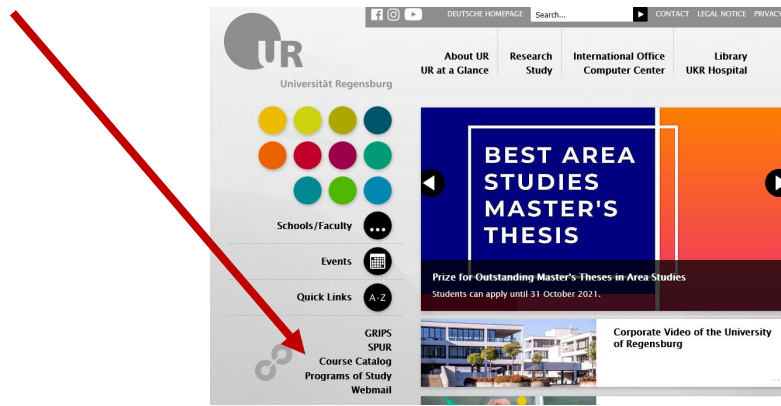
1. Terminology:

- ECTS Credits = Credits Points (CP), *Leistungspunkte (LP)*
- 1 lesson = 45 min
- Semester periods per week (*Semesterwochenstunde (SWS)*): The number of lessons per week.

2. Course selection => Course Catalogue

Due to the late release date of the course catalogue, we recommend that you first decide on the **types of courses** you are interested in (such as "Einführung in Neuere Deutsche Literaturwissenschaft" or "Vorlesung und Übung in Marketing") and finalize your course planning after your arrival in Regensburg.

3. This is what you can already do before your arrival in Regensburg:

Talk to your institutional or departmental coordinator at your home university about the number and type (e. g. lecture, seminar etc.) of courses that you should register for in Regensburg as well as about the number of exams you ought to take.

Various courses at Universität Regensburg are taught in **English**. You will find a **list** of those courses here:

The normal course load is **30 ETCS per semester**. In addition to courses from your degree programme, you can also take **courses in German as a foreign language or other languages**.

4. How many ECTS Credits do I get for a course?

I) Course catalogue

Many instructors have listed the number of ECTS credits in the basic data section of their courses. If it is not listed, you can find the number of ECTS in the module catalogue or by contacting the departmental advisor (see list of advisors attached).

II) Information on special subject areas

a) Law:

Normally 2 ECTS Credits for each semester period per week (SWS)

Exceptions: Seminar with paper: 12 ECTS, if you pass a beginner's exam or a beginner's paper add an extra 2 ECTS.

b) Business, Economics and Management Information Systems:

Usually 4 ECTS for a lecture, and 2 ECTS for a tutorial. Seminars have 6 ECTS. Please note, that normally you need to take both: lecture and seminar in order to receive your credits. It is not possible to do the tutorial without the lecture.

c) German ("DaF") and foreign language courses ("SFA") offered by Zentrum für Sprache und Kommunikation (= ZSK, "Center of Language and Communication"),

For general language courses: 1.5 ECTS Credits for each semester period per week

For courses related to course of study (eg. Business English, Spanish for Law): 2 ECTS Credits for each semester period per week.

d) German Culture Courses

Offered by the language center e.g. courses on German popular culture, German cinema = 5 ECTS

e) Political Science

Lecture: 4 ECTS, advanced seminar (Hauptseminar): 10 ECTS, courses within the practical module: 5 ECTS

Attention: Grundkurse are not open to exchange students.

f) History

Lecture: 4 ECTS, introductory seminar (Proseminar): 4 ECTS, advanced seminar (Hauptseminar): 10 ECTS, basic course (Grundkurs): 3 ECTS

Attention: courses in Southeastern or Eastern European History have a different number of credits: lecture = 2 ECTS, core course = 6 ECTS, seminar/tutorial: 6 ECTS

g) Pharmacy

Since Pharmacy is a state examination degree program which is not modularized, ECTS are relevant only for international exchange students. Therefore, the ECTS are not published in the course catalogue.

Normally you get 1 ECTS per contact hour. Example: a course with 2 contact hours per week is allocated with 2 ECTS.

h) Romance Philology

Introductory lecture (2hrs per week): 3 ECTS

Other Lectures: 4 ECTS

Language Courses (2hrs per week): 4 ECTS

Language Courses (4hrs per week): 8 ECTS

Introductory seminars (= Proseminare): 5 ECTS

Advanced seminars (= Hauptseminare): 8 ECTS

Exercise courses/tutorials: usually 4 ECTS, it can vary though depending on the individual course

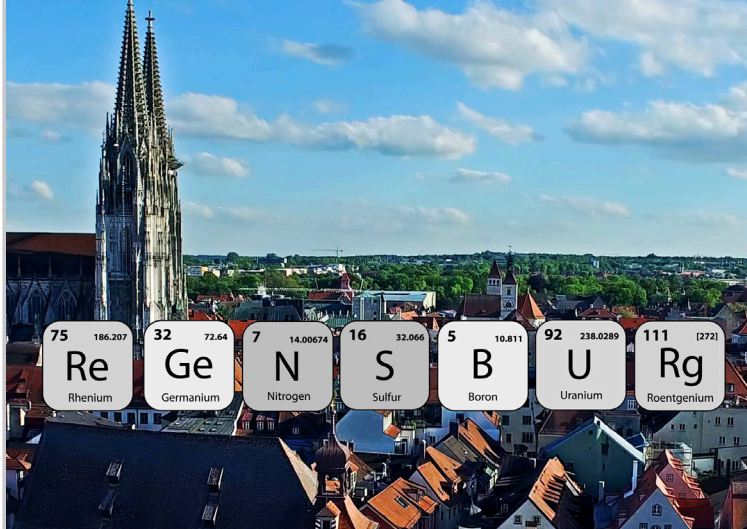
City and Student Life

Bachelor Program Chemistry

The bachelor program starts each winter semester in October. It gives an overview of the core subjects of chemistry and the basics of mathematics and physics. Thirteen compulsory modules span over a period of six semesters. Additionally, students choose one of several elective modules during their final year so as to gain a deeper insight into additional areas of chemistry.

UR's Faculty of Chemistry and Pharmacy has started to offer several courses of the Bachelor program in English on demand to cater to the need of exchange students that have no or only a basic knowledge of German.

Exception: 1st year Bachelor courses are taught in German only.

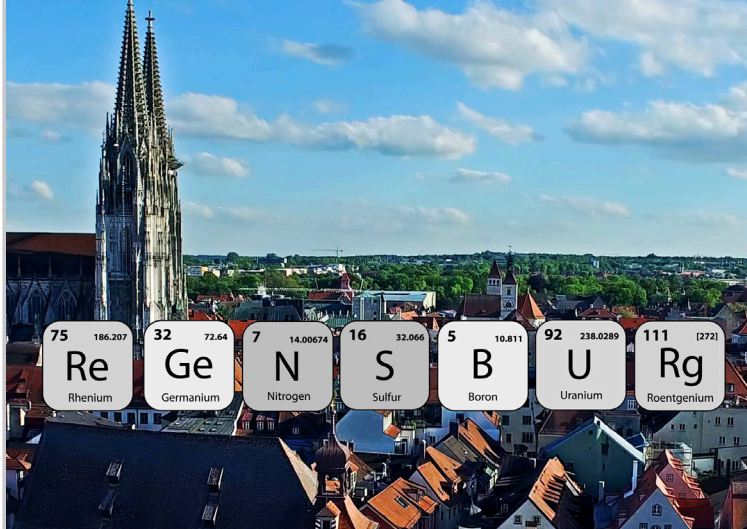
City and Student Life

Bachelor Program Chemistry

The bachelor program starts each winter semester in October. It gives an overview of the core subjects of chemistry and the basics of mathematics and physics. Thirteen compulsory modules span over a period of six semesters. Additionally, students choose one of several elective modules during their final year so as to gain a deeper insight into additional areas of chemistry.

UR's Faculty of Chemistry and Pharmacy has started to offer several courses of the Bachelor program in English on demand to cater to the need of exchange students that have no or only a basic knowledge of German.

Exception: 1st year Bachelor courses are taught in German only.
